SATRO Champions

Towards the end of the last academic year three teams of six students took part in the SATRO Problem Solving Challenge, an engineering competition against other schools. This year was the first ever virtual competition, held in individual schools, with the organisers explaining the task to the competitors via video. The students worked under time constraints to construct a device to fulfil various criteria and while each team competed against students in the same Key Stage across the country, they all worked on the same problem.

A team of our GCSE students excelled themselves by winning the Key Stage 4 category, a feat made even more impressive by the fact that their score was the highest of all the Key Stage winners. This means that they beat all the other 39 teams that took part countrywide and fully deserved the trophy they were awarded.

Very well done to the team, whose members were Anaika, Grace, Cecily, Daisy, Dilusha and Vedika.

The school's A level team showed equally great teamwork, performing commendably to earn a runners-up

place in the Key Stage 5 competition.

All three teams tackled the tasks with enthusiasm and deserve every accolade.

We think everyone who took part will agree it wasn't easy. Fiona Bruce; we take our hats off to you!



Sarah Represents Great Britain in Water Polo Championships







From 19th-29th August, I represented Great Britain in the Women's European Junior Water Polo Championships in Sibernik, Croatia. Securing a place in the squad, as the 1st goalkeeper, was the crowning moment of four years of intense training and challenging competition.

Due to constant lockdowns, the last



18 months have been particularly difficult for maintaining fitness, as all the pools were shut down for most of the time. This meant that two years of training were crammed into two months of highly intense training in Manchester, Sheffield, Matlock and a summer camp in Millfield, but the team was determined to make it work and we managed to create a squad of promising junior athletes.

We went to Croatia knowing that we would face one of the best teams in the world (Europe has the largest number of world-class teams). Teams like Spain that had a Silver Olympic medallist playing. Unfortunately, we had the hardest group in the competition, and each game proved to be a battle for survival! Our lack of international experience was evident in our group plays, and we were unsuccessful in scoring any points. Having said this, we grew more confident in our abilities as a team with each game, and gave some of our opponents tough matches. In particular, our last two matches were wins against Turkey and Romania, which meant we left the championship on a high note, placing 17th within water-polo's most elite teams.

From a development perspective, the championship offered a valuable high-level experience that will continue into further international opportunities. I am currently training with the Under 19s GB squad, with the hopes of representing Britain again next year.

From a personal perspective, I felt very proud to sing along to the national anthem before every game, and to wear GB colours. Being able to save goals from some of the best shooters in Europe was the ultimate highlight of my experience, and it is something I want to improve with.

This amazing journey did, in fact, start at Old Palace, when Mrs Tamplin introduced me to water-polo (I didn't even know that such a discipline existed before), and I will be forever grateful to the school for placing me on that path and the support I have received from all my teachers. I wouldn't have been able to combine all those hours of training and studies without their patience and words of encouragement.


Sumaiya Hosts London Youth Assembly

LONDON YOUTH ASSEMBLY

Yes, that really is Sumaiya (Year 10) with Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan! In summer 2020, Sumaiya was chosen to represent Croydon on the London Youth Assembly (LYA) – an organisation hosted by the offices of the Mayor of London and London Assembly that provides representation for young people aged 11-18 from across all of London's boroughs. Her fellow youth assembly members quickly chose her as their Chair and she has led the organisation over the past year in focusing on the consequences that Covid has had on education and services for young people in London. This work included constructing and circulating an online survey that received over a thousand responses and formed the basis of a report entitled 'The impact of COVID-19 on education & opportunities for young people in London:

To promote the key recommendations and to round off her year as chair, Sumaiya organised a Young Londoner's Question Time event that took place at City Hall on 31 August, 2021. The event was introduced by Mayor Sadig Khan and included a stellar panel of: Labour's Shadow Secretary of State for Education, Kate Green; Green Party leader and London assembly member, Sian Berry; Conservative Chair of the London Assembly, Andrew Boff; peer outreach worker, Javaun Bance; and author and headteacher, Dr Kulvarn Atwal. The panel discussion covered important questions about how to make education as inclusive, equitable and expert as possible, covering a wide range of topics such as bullying, discrimination, PSHE, curriculum design and the general need for greater funding and training in the





education sector. Sumaiya showed phenomenal confidence and poise as she expertly chaired the two-hour event, keeping panellists to time in their responses while moderating and selecting questions from the youth assembly members, the live audience and those watching the live-stream from home. She even managed to persuade the panel to publicise the LYA's report and to commit to greater funding for the LYA going forward. Sumaiya

deserves huge congratulations on the critical work she has spearheaded over the last year and, in particular, on her performance at the Young Londoner's Question Time – it can only be a matter of time until we are all watching her on BBC Question Time!









Year 6 Topic: Blood Heart
