They hope the residents will enjoy seeing their creations and enjoy the surprise delivery of cards to look through.








After much deliberation, we have taken the difficult decision to postpone the Old Palace Community Lunch which was

Physics In Action: Suzie Imber



On our Physics trip earlier this term, we were very fortunate to receive an insight into a career in Space Science the investigation of our planet and our solar system - from Suzie Imber, who is based at NASA. She started off by completing a fouryear Physics degree at Imperial College and went on to complete a PhD at the University of Leicester.

Afterwards, she undertook two internships at NASA where her passion for Space Science grew and flourished. She stayed on to work there which continued to fuel her ambition.

She was then selected to be a participant for a BBC show (called *Astronauts, do you have what it takes?*) where she was faced with challenging and demanding tasks that examined her astronomical skills. However, she demonstrated perseverance and resilience, which enabled her to finish in first place.

Despite me not being interested in a

career involving astronomy, I consider Suzie Imber to be an inspirational and motivational figure. This is due to her amazing dedication and fascination in her career but what captivated me most about her life was that in every part of her journey she maintained her interest in activities and hobbies she did outside of work. She balanced her studies with a range of sports including canoeing, lacrosse martial arts and one of her greatest passions mountaineering which she still continues with today. Now whilst her team await results of missions to Mars, she is able to use the technology and skills she has learnt to research data about unexplored mountains that she aspires to discover and climb.

The Grinch Pays a Visit to Seniors






Year 7: SLT Runs Henna Workshop for Year 7

Old Palace Shines at the UK Space Design Competition



On Saturday, 11th December, a group of Old palace students went to Riddlesdown Collegiate to participate in the UKSDC NASA Space Competition.

The Old Palace Team was made up of a collective of Year 10, 11, 12 and 13 students and I think it's safe to say that we did an amazing job. We were the only all girls group competing there. #WOMENINSTEM.

We started the competition at 8:00 and finished late at 18:00. For the competition, we had to design and develop a space-based infrastructure set in the Year 2051 on the comet 67P/ Churyumov-Gerasimenko. As a team, we were provided with a RFP (request for proposal) which told us what we needed to think of and include in our final presentation in order to complete our design. Within our team, we had to work in four main smaller groups



 automation, structuring, human and operations. Each of these groups had specific points to research and brainstorm ideas for.

Our final PowerPoint was outstanding, with the judges loving our concepts for visuals designs drawn by Dimanthi in Year 12. We also cannot forget to credit our President of the group – Varshini, who did an amazing job taking control, organising and managing the whole group of roughly 30 Old Palace students, and also to both the Vice presidents for engineering and business, Catherine and Mary (Year 11).

However, we cannot forget to credit the team who generated research and ideas for our project, because without you, we wouldn't have achieved what we did in the final presentation.

Saturday has taught us all patience, resilience and more so, the power of

teamwork. I think that within Old Palace as a school especially, we thrive of the ability to work well and inclusively with one another and that most definitely helped us with the competition. Our school performed exceedingly well on Saturday and we have certainly gained some experience from that event. So a massive well done to Old Palace for their hard work and tears and even though we didn't win in the judges eyes, we won in our own.

A traditional and accepted abbreviation of 'Christmas'. First appeared in 1100 and was used throughout the early modern period. Recent style guides wrongly claim xmas is a modern informality. It is a fusion of the Greek letter ' χ ' (chi), short for $\chi \rho_i \sigma \tau_0 \varsigma$ (Christos) - the anointed one - Referring to Jesus - and the word 'mass' (a celebration of the Eucharist) which comes from the Latin 'missa' - dismissal prayers - and ultimately mitto (I send)



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
