












Prep Jubilee Celebrations continued

It wasn't long before we found a suit of armour. We tried to imagine how anybody would be able to move, see or even speak whilst wearing it; we all thought it would certainly be very hot and heavy.







We walked through a huge dining room, a Long Gallery (just like our own one at Seniors) and a library. We saw the schoolroom where Anne Boleyn learnt to count on an abacus, then climbed a stone spiral staircase to see the King's bedroom. There was a fourposter bed which had a roof; we learnt that this was to protect the King from spiders and creepy crawlies. There

were even curtains to pull around the bed to keep the King warm. A guide showed us a very interesting bed warmer which the King's servant filled with hot coals to warm the sheets (without burning them).

We saw a long sword and a beautiful dress decorated with jewels which had been worn by the Queen. Once outside the castle, we had to find our way out of the yew maze before heading for a picnic lunch on the lawns. Finally, we had tremendous fun in the castle playground on the enormous slide, but we still don't know if dragons exist?



Year 4 Visits Sea Life, London

Earlier this month, Year 4 took the train to Waterloo Station to visit Sea Life, London as part of their learning about the 'Blue Abyss'. We started the day by walking over the glass floor as sharks circled below us!

We attended a workshop: Habitat Explorers. It was a chance to apply everything we had learnt about the layers of the ocean, the extreme environment and the adaptations that marine animals have had to make in order to survive there. The final task was to design our own marine animal to live in a specific layer or layers, with relevant adaptations for their survival. Our facilitator was very impressed with our knowledge of the oceans and said it was the best workshop he had taken!

After lunch, we were able to explore the exhibits. The highlights included sharks, rays and turtles, having our photograph taken with an accommodating penguin, touching star fish and seeing the spectacular jellyfish.

Walking back to Waterloo in the heavy rain was a fitting finale to our water-themed day!
