
RSPB Wild Challenge Bronze Award

Over the last year our Be Wild Club pupils have connected with the natural world by taking part in the RSPB Wild Challenge. After completing six activities they have achieved their Bronze Award.

To earn their certificates they have had to complete activities that both 'Help Nature' and 'Experience Nature'. This included making Habitat Heaps for night creatures to live in, a minipond to attract dragonflies and pond skaters, and making bird feeders.

The girls have made journey sticks to map a journey and created a collage to represent and recall the adventure. They have also completed a Plant Safari on the school field and looked closer at the flora and fauna – observing and making drawings of the very smallest flowers they could find.
