Finally, we spent an hour in the Wonderlab – a huge room full of interactive scientific activities and shows by the museums's explainers on subjects like the phases of the moon and electricity.

After cleaning our coins in a mixture of vinegar and sodium chloride, we watched in wonder as they were heated in a 'magic' solution to gain a silver zinc coating.
