Dear all,



Why does Santa have White Hair?

Christmas is soon approaching and everywhere you look is merchandise of a little man in red with a famous white beard.

Santa is well known for his prominent snow-white hair but how did he get it?

When Santa was younger it's likely he had different coloured hair from black to ginger, just like you and me. The colour of your hair is determined by your genes, which you get from your mum and dad.


A strand of hair can be split into two parts, the shaft and the root. The shaft is the coloured part of your hair which we can see. The root is the bottom part which has the job of keeping the hair attached to your scalp. Every root is surrounded by a tube of tissue under the skin called the hair follicle. Each hair follicle contains pigment cells which make a chemical called melanin. The darker your hair is the more melanin your body creates, and the



lighter, the less. Melanin is the same chemical that gives your skin its colour.

But this doesn't answer our question of Santa having white hair...

As people get older, the pigment cells in our hair follicles gradually start to die. Dead pigment cells cannot create any melanin, so the strand of hair grows to be grey, silver or in Santa's



case white. Eventually all the pigment cells die and all the hair changes colour.

To conclude, Santa's thick shiny beard is a sign he is eating healthy and the colour white certainly tells us he is very old, although don't tell him that or you might get a sack of coal!
