# Success in the Croydon Schools Primary Swimming Championships



#### Success in the Croydon Schools Primary Swimming Championships

Huge congratulations to Hiru, Aanya and Anokhi in Year 5, Sarah and Tamalia in Year 6 and Lana in Year 3, who competed in the prestigious Croydon Schools Primary Swimming Championship finals last Friday evening.

The girls all swam tremendously well and collected a massive haul of thirteen medals between them!

Hiru was triumphant in the Year 5 Backstroke, securing a fantastic new Championship record and beating the existing record set in 2016 by 0.08 of a second! She also came fourth in the Open Butterfly.

Aanya swam a great race, winning the Year 5 Breaststroke in a nail-bitingly close finish. Lana, who is only in Year 3, swam a magnificent race - winning the combined Year 3 & 4 Breaststroke. She held her beautiful stroke for the whole 25 metres to touch ahead of her rivals. Our Medley Relay, comprising of Hiru (Backstroke), Aanya (Breaststroke) and Tamalia (Freestyle), swam their hearts out, touching in a great second place, having qualified in fourth position. Anokhi was third in the Year 5

Freestyle, finishing a place ahead of her qualifying position. Our Freestyle relay of Tamalia, Sarah, Hiru and Anokhi bettered their entry position too, finishing in a hard-earned bronze medal place. Tamalia was also fourth in her Year 6 Freestyle.

Old Palace records show that this year is the first time we have had three champions in one evening since 2007! Old Palace were also girls runners up overall. Mrs Tamplin was delighted with the results and very proud of each and every one of the swimmers.





#### Year 2: Coastline's RNLI Workshop



Last Thursday, the girls in Year 2 enjoyed a special visit from Mick, a member of the RNLI. The RNLI workshop brought to life the learning in the Cornerstones topic, Coastline.

He explained how the RNLI was founded by Sir William Hillary in 1824. Next year, the organisation will be celebrating its 200th birthday! The girls particularly enjoyed using an interactive map to locate the life boat

stations around the UK and watching clips of rescues at sea. Mick was so impressed with the knowledge, understanding and enquiring questions from the class. Sienna and Amelia made cards to thank Mick and his colleagues for their bravery and dedication.

Students could submit a creative item they wanted on the theme of being safe online; this could range from a song, a poem, a design, a poster, a painting, a play to pretty much any interesting thing!


Now that we have received the entries, we have taken the time to judge them in depth. It was an extremely difficult

#### Year 5: Visit to Hever Castle







On 24th March, Year 5 visited Hever Castle to complement their studies on the Tudors. As the childhood home of Anne Boleyn, a focus of our topic, it was the perfect venue. The castle was also a gift to Anne of Cleves from Henry VIII after Anne Boleyn's family had been disgraced. Anne Boleyn's and Katherine of Aragon's Latin prayer books were also on display, brought together for the first time in 500 years for the current exhibition.

During our tour of the castle, we all had multimedia guides which told us about

each of the rooms including the Great Hall and Long Gallery where long-ago they played tennis and entertained. The guides also had games relating to Tudor cures for illnesses and delicacies that they enjoyed eating. We saw the room in which Anne successfully battled against the sweating sickness and examples of brutal instruments used for punishing crime!

Despite a terrible weather forecast, the weather held and we were able to enjoy free time in the amazing adventure playground, complete with death slide and a castle, as well as lunch by the lake.

Many of us are planning a return trip in the summer to enjoy the yew maze (which was waterlogged), the water maze and jousting display!

On Thursday this week, we are dressing up as Tudors for a day of fun activities – dancing, cooking, music, handwriting using quills and a tour of Seniors led by the Year 12s to show us all the parts related to the Tudors. More to follow!

#### Year 4: Visit Morden Snuff Mill

This week, Year 4 visited Morden Hall's Snuff Mill as part of their topic, Misty Mountain, Winding River. The River Wandle flows through Morden Park and the girls investigated various aspects of the river.



**Nia**: One of my favourite parts was the river dipping. I got to see new invertebrates that I didn't know about, including water shrimps and water spiders.

**Charlotte K**: My favourite part was definitely fishing out the invertebrates. These are small animals without backbones.

We caught a baby fish called a fry which has huge eyes and a tiny tail. They are a bit bigger than the invertebrates and can't survive in shallow water so we put it straight back in the river.

Ellie: Morden Hall Park was amazing. We explored the shallow, narrow, speedy river by the water mill and the deeper, wider, peaceful section. We looked at the beautiful meanders that curved perfectly in and out of the rose garden. To prove that the outer side of the river was faster than the inner side we did an experiment with dog biscuits. We dropped one on the outer side and one on the inner and noticed the outer one moved much faster.

We then chose two sites along the river and measured how deep the water was, the temperature, oxygen levels and speed of the water.

After lunch, we did some river dipping at each site, taking it in turns to go to the edge of the river and stick a net in, hoping there would be something good inside it. Those waiting used a key to identify the invertebrates that had just been caught.
