Many congratulations to Year 13 student Dimanthi, who was invited to Buckingham Palace last week to collect her Gold DofE award from The Duke of Edinburgh .

Although she managed to complete the physical (fitness) and skills (piano playing) sections at home, Diamanthi was unable to undertake any volunteering (working in a charity shop for a year) until restrictions lifted, so it did take her longer than usual.
